

NOTABLE ELDER



CAROLE MARPLE

When Carole was ready for full-time work, she became the Sherborn Town Clerk. It was the perfect job for her because it satisfied a long thread that has run through her life since she was a small girl. From an early age, her mother taught her how important and satisfying it is to give service to others and the Town Clerk's job does exactly that, helping the state, helping the town, and helping people.

Tomboy Carole grew up in Delaware, having access to her grandparents and her greater family. She graduated from Mount Pleasant High School in 1962 and from the Univ. of Delaware in 1966. During her college years she met and married Dan Marple, and for the next 12 years the couple led a nomadic life moving from one city to another seven times as required by Dan's job. It was not a lot of fun as Carole painted and refurbished whatever apartment or house they chose to make into a home.

During those years two sons, Danny and Steven were born.

The Marple family finally landed in Sherborn in time for the blizzard of '78. Their choice of a house on Stoneybrook Rd. was made easy when they saw children in the neighborhood and knew there would be friends for their boys and their daughter Beth, who was born a year later. Now for the first time they knew the children would have continuity in their schooling and friendships. When the children enrolled at Pine Hill School, in a sense Carole went with them. She became an indispensable volunteer for all the many ways that she could help. For example, she was Co-Chair of volunteers at PHS for five years, Co-President of Positive Care at DSMS, arranged Teacher Appreciation Days, and worked with the Umbrella Group at DSHS.

Her influence stretched out into the community: she was a member of the Board of the Sherborn Community Center, a long- time member of the Benevolent Society, and is presently an associate member of the COA.

In 1987, tragedy struck when Danny was killed in an automobile accident. It was a lifetime of sorrow, but Carole found some solace in immersing herself in the many volunteer activities at Pilgrim Church. She served on nearly every committee at the church and is proud of her participation in the Interfaith Hospitality Network, now called Family Promise. She's helped at A Place to Turn, Natick food pantry, and initiated the Election Day Food Drive while she was Town Clerk. She became town clerk in 1999 and was repeatedly re-elected until she retired in 2020.

During those 21 years she enjoyed the many responsibilities of the job, keeping town records, explaining the law and issuing marriage licenses to name a few. Sometimes (if she was lucky) she was given the privilege of performing the wedding ceremony.

Her influence spread beyond the borders of Sherborn. She was a member of the MA Town Clerks Association and, among other activities, a member of the Education Committee. However, the Association was not always bent on legislative matters. It created its own cookbook!

Now divorced from Dan, Carole has downsized to a pleasant apartment in Woodhaven. There she can see her children and grandchildren who live close by. Presently she is deeply involved in smoothing the way with love and caring for her daughter-in-law as she travels the path of Alzheimer's.
